- 2. **Unifrog Integration:** We are currently exploring a partnership with Unifrog to provide students with tools for exploring careers, building CVs, and tracking progress.
- 3. **Parent Engagement:** Workshops and events for parents are planned but will depend on scheduling and availability.
- 4. **Work Experience:** We are exploring the possibilities of piloting a work experience programme for identified years between 11–14 during this academic year. The programme will evolve into an embedded part of our curriculum based on the trial and feedback.



Reinforcement Through Curriculum

Our careers programme is strategically integrated into the curriculum to ensure students gain relevant skills and knowledge. Examples include but are not limited to:

Key Stage 4 and 5 Courses:

- Mandatory for Year 14: BTEC Work Skills, BTEC Personal Growth, and Wellbeing.
- **Optional BTEC's**: Vocational Studies, Childcare, Hospitality and Tourism, Health and Social Care, Public Services.
- Life Skills: Optional at KS4 and 5.

ASDAN Curriculum:

- Core Subject for Years 7-9: "Transition Challenge" programme with careers focus.
- Core Subject for Years 12 and 13: "Working Towards Independence" programme with careers focus and internal work experience.
